Counseling Connection

During the month of May, we will be celebrating cooperation at Woodland. Your child will be learning what cooperation is and how he or she can work and play cooperatively. Outlined below, are our topics for each week:

- Week 1: Defining Cooperation
- Week 2: Working and Playing Together
- Week 3: Being a Good Sport

Please talk with your child at home about what he or she has learned. To further support the skills your child is learning, please see below for activities that you can do at home.

Suggested Activities:

- a. Talk to your child about how cooperation means everyone does his or her part. Divide household chores, giving everyone some responsibilities. It is often helpful to provide a written list that your child can check off as he or she completes the jobs. Provide some type of reward or incentive, such as a movie or game time, that everyone can enjoy together when all chores are complete.
- b. Discuss how cooperation is required at your place of work. Tell your child about examples of how cooperation on the job has helped get things done, then give examples of what has happened when people haven't cooperated.
- c. We will be talking about and practicing what it means to be "a good sport". At home, you could play a card game or a board game with your child and praise your child for being a good sport. If necessary, remind him or her of how a good sport acts.
- d. Occasionally, watch or join in games with your child and praise him or her for being a good sport. If necessary, remind your child about good sportsmanship.
- e. If your child enjoys watching sports on TV, make comments about the cooperation and sportsmanship that you see the players demonstrating.

Social skills are essential for a successful future. Thank you for the opportunity to work with your child.
